## 2025 FHC GUIDANCE NOTES

To assist prospective competitors both old and new, here are a few points to bear in mind when completing the registration form for the Championship and some hints about competing in 2025. If you have any queries or concerns please contact any of the following:

- 1) Complete your Championship Registration online at ferrariclubracing.co.uk: Please provide all the information requested. You must give all details pertaining to your entered car(s) in the appropriate boxes including any changes to your car from the original manufacturer's specification. Drivers competing with cars not registered for the Championship are not eligible to score championship points.
- 2) **Registration Fee:** £195 payable online by Debit/Credit Card at the time of registration.
- 3) Car Eligibility: The Championship Eligibility Scrutineer will be keeping an eye on our cars during the season. He may check any car at any time to see that it complies with the 2025 regulations, so please make sure your car complies as eligibility infringements could result in loss of Championship points or a ban from all Ferrari Owners' Club competition. If you make changes to your car at any time after the initial registration process you must immediately advise one of the Championship Coordinators named above in writing.
- 4) Event Entries: These must be submitted directly to the Event organising clubs. Event regulations and entry forms can usually be found on the website of the Organising Club. If it is not possible to download them from the website or enter online, please contact a Coordinator named above. It is recommended that you enter without delay to make sure you do not miss out on your favourite venue as many events are oversubscribed.
- 5) **No Shows:** If you have to withdraw from an event you must immediately advise the organising club's Event Secretary. You should also advise a Championship Coordinator named above.
- 6) Competition Numbers: These will be allocated by the Event organising clubs. It is your responsibility to have these numbers on your car at the meeting. You are required to use FHC Championship backing sheets for your competition numbers these will be issued to competitors at your first event. You will also be supplied with number plate covers, which must be fitted to your Ferrari at all times during the event. Please remember that the competition numbers must be removed or completely covered before leaving the event and the plates covers removed in accordance with the 2025 FHC regulations.
- 7) **Tyres:** Please note that all cars must use Motorsport UK List 1A or 1B tyres as indicated in the FHC Regulations.
- 8) **Appearance:** Make sure your car is well presented & maintained to an acceptable standard. We should take pride in the presentation of our Ferraris.
- 9) **Starters:** The definition of 'starter' is anyone taking part in the competition by virtue of beginning a practice run (and therefore receives one point). Anyone taking part in an 'official' run (even if no time recorded) is deemed to have gained Championship points according to their position in timed runs.
- 10) **The Baracca Classic Trophy:** This is an annual award presented at the end of season awards to the driver with the highest Championship Points in a Classic tipo. Cars built prior to the Ferrari 360 are eligible for this award and highlighted on the results sheets.
- 11) **Safety Equipment:** Whilst harnesses and other equipment are not required, motorsport is an inherently dangerous activity. There are multiple additional safety considerations such as race harness, HANS device / SIMPSON harness that are worth investigation. Contact a Championship Coordinator if you wish to discuss this in more detail.
